Missouri S&T

Academics are the main focus at Missouri S&T. And whether you are entering Missouri S&T as a member of the Freshman Engineering Program or as a student in one of the many sciences, computing, or liberal arts fields, you will be instructed by some of the best faculty around.

Over 99 percent of Missouri S&T faculty members hold the top degree awarded in their field, and they are trained to assist our first-year students with the adjustments required for success at the college level. To further assist first-year students, Missouri S&T provides resources outside the classroom like a counseling center, writing center and an exciting program called Learning Enhancement Across Disciplines (LEAD). LEAD provides students in the first and second year of study with additional tutoring, while they adjust from life at home to a rigorous and challenging new experience at college. All together, these resources add up to undeniable student success and a record-setting 88 percent retention rate from freshman to sophomore year.

Missouri S&T also focuses on applying the knowledge dispensed in the classroom in the laboratory. Opportunities for undergraduate research abound, giving all students the chance to apply what they know to real-world situations. With more than \$52 million in research awards and grants, students are able to practice putting principles to use and to develop a working knowledge of industry advancements. Missouri S&T strives to help students be “street ready” engineers, scientists and entrepreneurs, giving them the skills and creativity necessary for a successful career.

The world of science and technology is ever-changing, and students at Missouri S&T learn to become life-long learners, innovators and creators.

Students participate in everything from fundraising to oil changes, teaching them to be truly industry-ready engineers and business people.

Other students choose to participate in one of the service learning student groups like Engineers Without Borders. These students travel abroad to Central and South America helping rural and remote villages solve problems with unclean water supplies and poor sanitation systems. They are able to put their knowledge to use in a way that can truly change an entire community's future.

Phelps County, of which Rolla is the county seat, includes such diverse industries as Brewer Science, Inc., Mo-Sci, Inc., USGS, Wal-Mart Distribution Center, Mark Twain National Forest Headquarters, Royal Canin

USA, Inc. and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. Missouri S&T is positioning itself as one of the nation's top technological research universities. Phelps County also includes HyPoint Industrial Park and the new Missouri S&T Innovation Park where cutting-edge, high-tech industries are making Rolla their home.

High quality medical facilities at Phelps County Regional Medical Center and St. John's Clinic, together with an abundance of cultural opportunities at Castleman Hall (Missouri S&T's 650-seat Performing Arts Center), the Ozark Actors Theatre and ArtsRolla!, are additional assets that make Rolla such a desirable place to live, work and play.

Rolla Introduction

Incorporated in 1861, the City of Rolla has come a long way from its humble beginnings as a major railway stop for the Frisco Line. Rolla is now a regional center of government, education, shopping, dining, culture and health care in South Central Missouri.

Rolla's small, rural setting provides a safe, cozy community located almost directly between the first and third largest cities in Missouri – St. Louis and Springfield. Rolla's central location on Interstate 44 makes it the perfect stopping point for travelers, and it makes a quick weekend trip to larger metropolitan areas a breeze for students looking just to get away or spend a weekend shopping, visiting museums and going to concerts.

Nestled in the Ozarks, Rolla is surrounded by the natural beauty unique to south-central Missouri. Rolling hills, country highways and spring-fed rivers make the area a perfect fit for any outdoor activities - hunting, fishing, canoeing and swimming are among the local favorites. Rolla is also near the only United States national forest in Missouri, Mark Twain National Forest, which spans 1.5 million protected acres and provides an ideal location for hiking and camping excursions. Nearby Lane Springs and Meramec Spring Park are also extremely popular outdoor recreation areas.

There's plenty of entertainment to be had indoors as well. Rolla is home to the acclaimed Ozarks Actors Theatre, a summer stock theatre troop, and Leach Theatre, located in the Castleman Hall Performing Arts Center on the Missouri S&T campus, which features student-run productions throughout the year. A skating rink, bowling alley, movie theatre, mini-golf and go-cart complex and local wineries round out the entertainment options.

Most importantly, Rolla is a community focused on the students at Missouri S&T. From Opening Week festivities to the St. Patrick's Day Parade, the Rolla community strives to make this a home away from home.

Rolla also celebrated its 150th Anniversary during the Rolla Sesquicentennial Celebration on June 4, 2011, in downtown Rolla.



Shopping & Dining

Rolla boasts an historic downtown centralized around Pine Street. Here you will find dining, shopping and numerous nightlife options, including some of the most popular establishments frequented by current students and alumni. Alex's Pizza Palace has been serving their famous pizzas and gyros to Rolla regulars since 1964. Alongside Alex's, downtown visitors can shop in quaint retail boutiques like Red Door Gifts and Peacock Stained Glass & Gifts, or peruse the latest book selections at the award-winning Reader's Corner. In addition to thriving Pine Street, many restaurants, retail shops and nightlife locations dot the surrounding landscape. From fine dining steakhouses to a quick cup of joe on the run, there's something for every taste and speed.

St. James, MO, a unique city along Historic Route 66, is just 10 miles east of Rolla on I-44. It is home to several wineries, including St. James Winery and Meramec Vineyards Winery. The beautiful landscapes and vistas make for a perfect weekday activity. And while you're there, be sure to visit beautiful Meramec Spring Park, and pick up a hand-dipped, homemade scoop of ice cream from Ruby's Ice Cream in downtown St. James.

Small, local businesses in the Rolla area quickly feel like home to visitors and new students alike.

Community Living

Building home and hearth in Rolla is a wise investment for multiple reasons. The city's culture is enhanced by its proximity to Missouri S&T and the lush landscape of rolling green hills adds to the serenity and the adventurous, outdoorsy aspect of the community. Location is Rolla's crown jewel—the vast majority of residents live within a 15-minute commute of their workplace.

Housing for both renters and buyers is incredibly affordable in Rolla. The mean price in 2009 for a single-family detached home was \$133,623, almost \$50,000 less than the state mean price of \$180,542. The mean price of townhouses and other attached units, \$133,950, is about \$40,000 less than the state mean price of \$174,118. Despite these affordable prices, 53 percent of residents rent rather than own. The median gross rent in 2009 was very inexpensive at \$554, making the city an ideal place for recent graduates and other young professionals.

Parks & Recreation

The Rolla City Parks and Recreation Department manages 33 parks, ranging from small, neighborhood parks with playground equipment to Ber Juan Park, which includes just about every indoor and outdoor recreational activity you can think of.

All together, these parks encompass more than 310 acres within the city, and provide open green space and a wide-range of recreational opportunities in proximity to nearly any location in Rolla.

Ber Juan Park spans nearly 85 acres of open grassland, trails and recreational facilities, and is located in the east-central part of Rolla, bordered on the south by 10th Street, on the west by Holloway and Farrar, on the north by 14th and 18th streets, and on the east by Burgher Branch.

The park includes The Centre, Rolla's 63,000-square-foot Health and Recreation Complex, tennis courts, SplashZone (Rolla's outdoor water park), a playground and picnic area, a skate park and the Ber Juan Sportsplex, a multi-field baseball, softball and soccer complex. A walking and exercise trail encompasses most of the park with outdoor fitness equipment stationed along the trail.

Schuman Park, roughly 15 acres, is second in size only to Ber Juan, among Rolla's currently developed park areas. In addition to its lighted softball field and four basketball courts, Schuman offers two playgrounds and a sand volleyball court. The field is also home of the Rolla Lady Bulldogs softball team.

The park also offers historical interest, including Frisco Pond, which once served as a major source of water for the railroad, and the restored Frisco steam engine, coal car and passenger car which are lighted and covered for protection from the elements and easy viewing. Guided tours are available by appointment.

Green Acres Park consists of 8.5 acres along Dieble Creek, south of Highway 72. The park offers a lighted softball field with bleachers that serves, along with Schuman Park and the Ber Juan Sportsplex, as a location for league games. In addition to its softball facilities, the park features a playground, picnic shelter/pavilion, basketball court and sand volleyball court.

In addition, the department also maintains the 40-acre Rolla Cemetery. Incorporated in 1861, it includes the Weber family cemetery, which dates back to the 1850s. It is located at the corner of Highway 72 and Rolla Street.

Although not owned by the city, Lions Club Park is yet another expansive piece of parkland in Rolla that is open to the public. The park spans roughly 180 acres off Highway 63 South and is home to the Rolla Lions Club's annual Fourth of July carnival. A vast array of playground equipment, barbecue pits, picnic areas with pavilions, hiking and biking trails, fields and a fishing lake make up this scenic park.

The following is a list of some of the city-owned pocket parks located in Rolla:

- Ann's Acres Park – a 1-acre neighborhood park located at Soest Road and South Murry Lane.
- Barnitz Park – located at the corner of 5th and Iowa.
- Breuer Park – consists of nearly seven acres located at 10th and Wakefield.
- Countryaire Park – an undeveloped park of just under an acre in size, located on Casey Lane.
- Coventry Park – a spacious, 16.5-acre park lying along Coventry Drive, bordering Burgher Branch in eastern Rolla.
- Deer Crossing Park – an undeveloped open park with .85 acres of land on Lanning Lane.
- Heritage Heights Park – two (2) undeveloped open acres off of McCutchen Drive
- Lanning Wooden Bridge Park – the city's smallest developed park at .03 acres, it is located at the corner of 4th and Main.
- Lariat Lane Park – an undeveloped park area encompassing 1.4 acres at the intersection of Southview and Lariat Lane.
- Maggi Park – just under .5 acres, it is located on Commercial Drive.
- Meadow Brook Park – an undeveloped 1-acre park located on Meadowbrook Drive.
- Murry Park – located at the corner of 10th Street and Angus Valley.
- Penny Park – an undeveloped park area located at the corner of Lester and Edith.
- Powell Park – located at the corner of 11th and Poole.
- Ridgeview Park - more than four acres of land around the intersection of Ridgeview and Morrell in western Rolla.
- Silverleaf Park – slightly more than 16 undeveloped acres, this park is located on Silverleaf Lane.
- Southview Park – a large park at 29 acres, it is located between the Hutchinson and Newcastle subdivisions along Dieble Creek. This park is currently undeveloped, but a section of the city's walking/biking path follows the creek through park land.
- Tim Ponzer Park – an undeveloped park consisting of 10.5 acres along Sycamore and Cypress Drives and Dieble Creek.
- Tory Park – located on Tory Drive in northeastern Rolla, this park is over 8 acres.
- Town & Country Park - an undeveloped park consisting of 2.1 acres lying along the creek near the intersection of Soest and Pinetree.
- Wedgewood Park – located on Chestnut Drive in southern Rolla, this park offers over 8 acres.

K-12 Education

Rolla students are served by the Rolla School District as well as a variety of private and parochial education options. Rolla Public Schools provide an eight-school system, with three elementary schools, one middle school, one junior high school, one high school, one technical center and one technical institute. The district prides itself on partnering with the community to provide the best possible educational opportunities to its students.

Private and parochial education is also readily accessible as a substitute for the public school system. Such schools and academies as St. Patrick Elementary School, Immanuel Lutheran School and Rolla Seventh-Day Adventist School, among many others, are excellent options for parents who would like their child's academics to merge with religious practice and education. Advanced schools from preschool through college, coupled with the emphasis on educational attainment, establish Rolla as the educational hub of South Central Missouri.



The Rolla region houses a diverse business community bursting with unmatched advantages. The Missouri University of Science and Technology is a major contributor to the area's economy, as are such industries as healthcare, distribution, manufacturing, engineering/ mapping and many others. The Rolla region also hosts Fort Leonard Wood, a U.S. Army Maneuver Support Center of Excellence, and is also recognized as the retail center for south central Missouri, offering patrons a great selection of stores to choose from.

The university-based economy is well-supported by a strategic location near major markets and interstate highways, along with low taxes, a dedicated workforce and high quality commercial and industrial sites. The region is also supported by various organizations dedicated to enhancing the business community in Rolla and its surrounding communities. The City of Rolla, the Rolla Area Chamber of Commerce, the Rolla Regional Economic Commission and the university are among many of the regional resources available to new and existing businesses of all types and sizes.

Healthcare

The Rolla area offers excellent medical care to the region, with excellent providers including Phelps County Regional Medical Center, St. John's Clinic and the Rolla Family Clinic, among many others. Patients of all ages are treated by the area's excellent physicians. Phelps County Regional Medical Center

Phelps County Regional Medical Center (PCRMC) anchors the local healthcare community. The 232-bed regional referral center supplies a long list of outstanding medical services, including comprehensive cancer, cardiology, surgery, women's health, sleep and imaging/laboratory services. The hospital is led by more than 100 knowledgeable physicians and a staff of 1,500-plus employees. St. John's Clinic – Rolla

Part of the top-rated St. John's Health System, St. John's Clinic – Rolla is a multi-specialty group practice housed within a modern, 108,000-square-foot facility. The clinic opened in fall 2009, consolidating the services of three St. John's Clinic facilities into one convenient, state-of-the-art center.
