## **Community Introduction**

Located high on a bluff overlooking the “Big River,” Vicksburg, Mississippi is an ideal community for locals and visitors alike. Steeped in history, this city’s personal stories and cultural heritage contribute to its charm. The area is a unique blend of the past and the present—with a strong focus on the future.

Welcoming over one and a half million visitors a year to the Vicksburg National Military Park, Antebellum homes and other attractions, Vicksburg has earned the name, “Red Carpet City of the South.” It is a community that is people-centered and growing.

Fifty-two thousand people reside within Warren County, about half of whom live inside the Vicksburg city limits. Access to the Mississippi River, Interstate 20 and rail service has led to a vibrant economy. Vicksburg is the home of a diverse group of manufacturers, distribution centers and government offices. Retail areas include an outlet center, mall and a revitalized downtown shopping area.

Vicksburg is recognized as a Certified Retirement Community and offers low tax rates, cultural and outdoor activities, and more. A full-service hospital and other medical facilities provide state-of-the-art health care for Warren County residents and serve patients from the surrounding areas.

There is something for everyone in this community, so whether you are visiting, relocating or a long-time resident —be prepared for something wonderful!



## History

To many, Vicksburg is synonymous with history. It is almost impossible to summarize in a few paragraphs, but here we make an attempt. The Mississippi River has long played a part in the historical, economic and residential development of Vicksburg. Founded in 1811 by Newitt Vick, Vicksburg was incorporated on January 29, 1825, and grew rapidly as a center for commerce, agriculture and river traffic.

Vicksburg's best known contribution to history is the role it played in the Civil War. Following Abraham Lincoln's election, the state seceded by a vote of 8,415 on January 9, 1861. With this vote, Mississippi followed South Carolina into the Confederate States of America. By February, seven states had seceded. President Davis gave his first address as the first President of the Confederate States of America.

Control of the Mississippi River was a strategic objective of the Northern and Southern armies. Simultaneous Union victories at Vicksburg and Gettysburg in July 1863 marked a decisive turning point in the Civil War.

The crossroads of river, rail, and highway at Vicksburg, combined with imposing defenses and a critical strategic objective, produced one of the most complex and protracted engagements of the Civil War, and involved joint operations between the army and navy; overland and over-water troop movements; and tactics of diversion, siege, and defense.

Vicksburg National Military Park, with its cultural and natural resources, today plays a vital role in our nation's heritage and provides a place of peace, reflection, enjoyment, and community engagement.

The monuments at Vicksburg comprise one of the largest collections of significant commemorative military art in the United States, and, indeed, one of the most extensive collections of such art in the world. Representing the

states involved, the monuments and memorials, with their varied symbolism, commemorate the campaign, siege, and defense of Vicksburg. New monuments continue to be added, including the recent memorial to black soldiers—the park's first monument to the U.S. Colored Troops.

Vicksburg's society was transformed by war, enduring changes that ranged from deprivation and destruction of a prosperous community to liberation of formerly enslaved people.

On April 26, 1876, the Mississippi River changed course and left the river port of Vicksburg with no river! The economic effect on the city was devastating. The change in the river course helped change Vicksburg's future. In 1873, a Vicksburg office of the Army Corps of Engineers was established to coordinate federal and local river management and flood control efforts. The city still enjoys the pleasure of being "home" to the Corps.



## Transportation

Vicksburg is strategically located at the intersection of Interstate 20 and the Mississippi River, giving it accessibility to both water and ground transportation. Additionally, there is rail service and two local airports provide convenient access to the area.

Bordering Warren County to the west, the Mississippi River connects Vicksburg and Warren County to the rest of the world. The Port of Vicksburg, located on the Yazoo Diversion Canal, sees more than 400 million tons of cargo pass through each year.

Traffic counts on Interstate 20 average nearly 55,000 vehicles per day. Vicksburg is the midpoint between Atlanta and Dallas, east to west. Jackson, the Mississippi state capital, is conveniently located 45 miles to the east. State Highway 61, also known as the Blues Highway, runs north through the Delta and south to Natchez alongside the Mississippi River.

Jackson International Airport (JAN), only a 50-minute drive, is the closest airport with access to commercial flights. Closer to Vicksburg, two public-use airports, Vicksburg Municipal Airport and the Vicksburg-Tallulah Airport offer lighted runways, aircraft repair and fuel services.

Residents and visitors can travel throughout the City on NRoute, the City's bus system. These air conditioned buses feature music from local Blues musicians and knowledgeable drivers who can assist passengers in reaching their destination quickly. ## Tourism

There is so much to see and do in Vicksburg—over 1.5 million visitors a year can testify to that! For the history buff, there is the 1,800-acre National Military Park, America's most monumented National Park, where the fate of a nation was decided in 1863. In its confines, you will find a Union ironclad gunboat, which had lain on the bottom of the Yazoo River for 102 years. Located a few miles away, 5,000 Confederates repose in Soldiers Rest in City Cemetery.

The Old Courthouse Museum, a National Landmark, survived the Civil War with minimal damage and houses over 10,000 artifacts from pre-Columbian times to present day. The Battlefield Museum near the Military Park features more memorabilia from the Civil War era.

For over five decades, Vicksburg was the center for the aristocracy. A glimpse of its former glory is evidenced by buildings and homes, dating to the 19th century. Tour historic homes, each filled with period antiques, many original to the homes. Two churches boast eight of the 11 Tiffany stained glass windows in Mississippi.

Historic Downtown Vicksburg offers boutiques with unique merchandise, at reasonable prices. A variety of dining options and coffee shops are interlaced with boutiques and unique stores in Historic Downtown Vicksburg.

River gaming is also a tourist draw and Vicksburg surely delivers with four casinos to choose from and a fifth casino under construction. Each property has a unique flavor and offers gaming, entertainment and delicious dining options.

Once you arrive in Warren County, there are plenty of options for places to stay. Local hotels/motels can

accommodate a wide-range of preferences and budgets. The City of Vicksburg inspects each hotel room once a year to ensure a clean and safe stay for all its visitors. If a bed and breakfast experience is more your style, you won't be disappointed, as many of the historic homes in Vicksburg have been converted to this service.

If you are a fan of food, you are in for a real treat. Vicksburg offers a wide-range of dining options for you to enjoy. Fine Italian dining, seafood, steaks, barbeque, Southern soul food or just a quick cup of coffee are all here for you to enjoy. ## Homes

Whether you are looking to buy or rent, Warren County has the perfect home for you. As you drive through Vicksburg you are certain to notice many architectural styles from a range of historic periods. You will also find new construction and several gated neighborhoods sprinkled throughout the area.

There are many Antebellum homes in the area. Some of the more spectacular homes have been converted to bed and breakfast facilities and are open for tour year-round, such as Anchuca, Cedar Grove and Belle of the Bends (please call homes to verify times) to name a few. Others are open only during spring or fall Pilgrimage events for viewing.

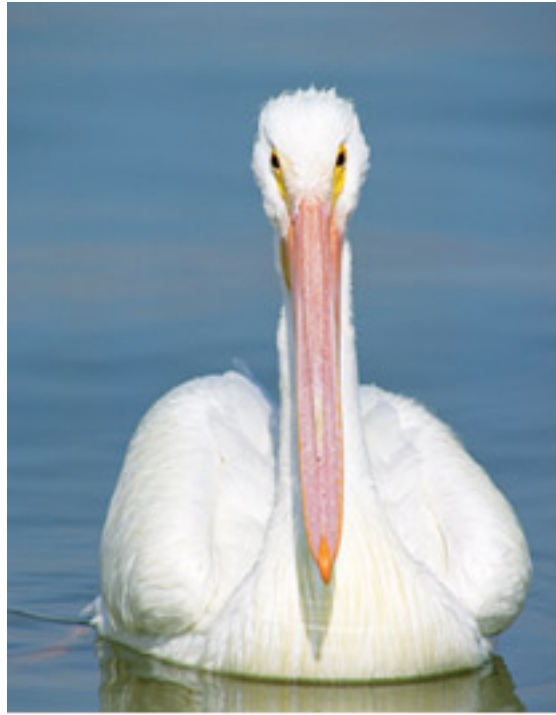
Still more homes are private residences. Occasionally, these beautiful homes are available for purchase—watch the real estate listings closely if you are in the market for one of these magnificent homes.

An urban renewal plan introduced in the late '90s has led to the renovation of the old downtown area. Loft-style apartments and homes have taken the place of the vacant buildings. Residents in the downtown area can take advantage of the shopping and dining along Washington Street and may enjoy a view of the canal from their balconies. It is an exciting place to be as revitalization efforts continue.

For those with more conventional housing needs, there are many family-friendly subdivisions and quaint neighborhoods to choose from. Prices of homes in Warren County range from \$60,000 - \$400,000 (and up). Rental property varies from newly constructed apartments and townhouses to corporate apartments to long-term homes for lease.

No matter what you choose, Warren County is a great place to live. You may hear it said: “Vicksburg is easy to

get to, and hard to leave!”



## Recreation

With a location on the banks of the Mississippi River, one would easily guess that there is much to do in the outdoors in Vicksburg. Popular sports include hunting, canoeing, kayaking and birding. As a matter of fact, the National Audubon Society ([www.msaudubon.org](http://www.msaudubon.org)) has a district office located in the heart of downtown Vicksburg. In addition, Tara Wildlife, Inc. ([www.tarawildlife.com](http://www.tarawildlife.com)), a 17,000-acre wildlife preserve located in the northernmost part of Warren County, hosts hunting trips in the fall and a fantastic children's camp in the summer.

There are two 18-hole golf courses in the county: Vicksburg Country Club and Clear Creek Golf Course. The city and county government also maintain sporting complexes that offer outdoor basketball, softball, tennis, soccer and swimming. If you are looking for a nice stroll, try one of the many parks in the community. Children should visit the Spray Fountain at the Art Park at Catfish Row, a new facility where kids can splash and enjoy artwork done by their peers. The Junior Auxiliary is planning to build an adjacent playground, too. Part of the Mississippi River Trail (MRT) also runs through Vicksburg for those who want to visit on their bicycles!

For those who prefer staying inside, try any of the historic tours through Antebellum homes or the National Military Park. You can also see Vicksburg on one of two scenic drives that are marked with red or blue signs throughout the area. Gaming is another alternative to explore in Vicksburg. Choose from four casinos: Ameristar Casino, Diamond Jacks Casino, Horizon Casino or Rainbow Casino. Each has their own personality and appeal.



## **Arts & Entertainment**

Vicksburg is naturally beautiful, but its artistic treasures bring out the real variety in the community. The Vicksburg Art Association, located in the Old Firehouse on Main Street, hosts several shows a year. Additionally, several art galleries on Washington Street set the stage for many local artists. The Attic Gallery has been showcasing artists for nearly 30 years. New on Washington Street is the H.C. Porter Gallery. Stop by to see colorful images of Mississippians and scenes from the state and find out about the current project: *Backyards & Beyond: Mississippians and Their Stories*. It is a compelling series detailing the destruction and rebuilding of the Mississippi Coast after hurricane Katrina.

The Southern Cultural Heritage Center is housed in what was once the St. Francis Xavier Convent and Academy. It is composed of five buildings including the Cobb House, the Sisters of Mercy Convent, the Auditorium, the Academy Building, and the O'Beirne Gymnasium. The Center offers year-round programming for children and adults. From children's art camps and karate, to adult cooking classes and ballroom dancing—there is something for everyone to enjoy at this complex.

Four Seasons for the Arts provides wonderful entertainment throughout the year, too. This dedicated group has been instrumental in the rejuvenation of an Independence Day celebration. Among other events, they coordinate the Vicksburg Chamber Music Festival and introduce many Vicksburg youngsters to the symphony each year.

Along the floodwall on Mulberry Street you can find more than 20 beautiful murals depicting events that have occurred in or near Vicksburg. The Vicksburg Riverfront Murals by Robert Dafford have transformed a gray and drab eyesore into a breathtaking and educational experience for all who view it. January ushers in the bridal planning season with the Beautiful Bride show. A bridal fashion show (complete with Mother-of-the-Bride fashions) and plenty of vendors fill the expo floor at this Vicksburg Convention Center (VCC) event. If you are getting married in the area, don't miss this one-stop shopping for the bride-to-be. To kick off the Christmas holiday each year, the VCC (managed by VenuWorks, Inc.) also hosts The Festival of Trees. A Friday evening gala gets everyone in the holiday spirit with plenty of fine food, entertainment and a silent auction. Saturday is the ever-popular Breakfast with Santa and other events such as a Senior Fashion Show, Safety Town, Children's Health Fair and of course the Marketplace. There are family activities throughout the day including an arts and crafts fair, activities for children, and plenty of great food and entertainment from local choirs and bands. The evenings bring thousands out to listen to the headliner bands on three stages at the Washington Street festival.

Vicksburg has for years been proud to host the Miss Mississippi pageant. Young women throughout the state compete for scholarship prize money and the chance to represent the state in the Miss America pageant. This event is held in late June or early July each year.

## **Education**

The Vicksburg-Warren School District serves nearly 9,500 students with eight elementary schools, two junior high schools and two high schools—Vicksburg High School and Warren Central High School.

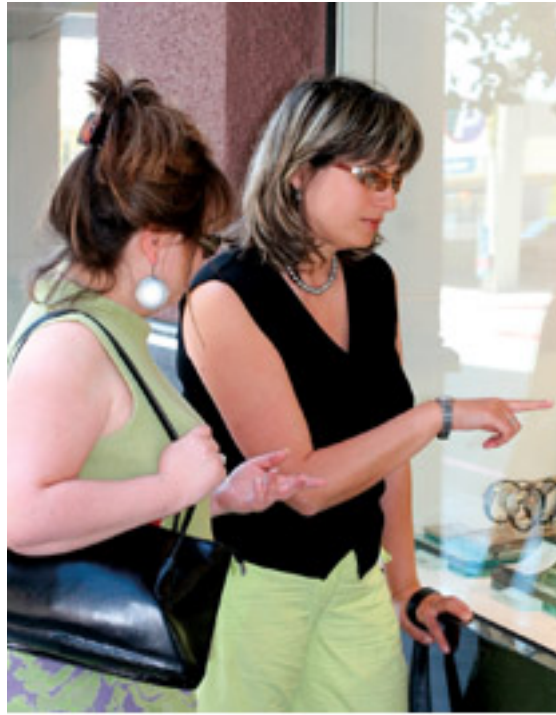
A dedicated administration and committed teachers are the backbone of this school system that generates educated and well-rounded young people.

Several private schools operate in Warren County, including Porters Chapel Academy and St. Francis Xavier/St. Aloysius High School. Both offer Kindergarten through twelfth grade courses. Newly founded Augustine Classical Christian School offers education to students grades nine through twelve. Campus Prep School receives children ages three years old through the seventh grade and Vicksburg Community School hosts students in the third through twelfth grade.

Hinds Community College, Vicksburg-Warren Campus, has a full range of programs available to students. They offer college-level academic, technical and career classes in business and office technology, practical nursing, and electrical technology—just to name a few. In order to meet the needs of Warren County’s workforce, specialized programs in welding, electricity, computer technology, safety and managerial skills are also offered.

Close by universities include Alcorn State University, Mississippi College, Jackson State University and Millsaps College. WES Graduate Institute is an association of universities and the U.S. Army Engineer Waterways Experiment Station (WES). Under this program, academic credit and graduate degrees can be earned from member universities through course work offered at WES. The Institute supports graduate study and research. It further enhances the exchange of scientific and technological information between the faculty of member universities and the researchers of WES. Member universities in the WES Graduate Institute include Louisiana

State University, Mississippi State University and Texas A & M.



## Shopping

Vicksburg residents truly shop until they drop. With the Main Street district downtown, the Pemberton Square Mall and Vicksburg's Factory Outlet, they are surrounded by choices.

Vicksburg Factory Outlet Mall opened in 1994 and was the first outlet shopping center in the area. Nearly 40 stores can offer up to 70% off of regular retail prices. Some of the shops you will find are Lane Bryant, Dress Barn, Big Dogs, The Gap, the Kitchen Collection, Paper Factory, Factory Brand Shoes, Carter's and more!

Pemberton Square Mall is Vicksburg's only local enclosed shopping center. It houses an eclectic combination of specialty stores and features Dillard's, Belk and JCPenney as anchor stores. Garfield's Restaurant and Pub, Wingo's, The Wok and the Cookie Store provide food for hungry shoppers year-round.

Main Street, the recently revitalized retail district along Washington Street downtown, is thriving with boutique and specialty shops and diverse dining and entertainment options. With places like the Men's Closet, Lorelei Books, Sassafras or Paper Plus to shop and Borello's and Rusty's Riverfront Grill to dine, you can't go wrong! Try all of the shops in Main Street—there is a treasure waiting in each one!



## **Business**

The diversity of businesses in Warren County has always provided a stability that our residents can count on. Its close proximity to the Mississippi River has been the key to Warren County's successful economy. The Port of Vicksburg is home to 21 businesses and industries and over 4,000 employees. Many goods pass through this port including metals, wood, chemicals, soybeans, corn, wheat and cotton. It is a designated Foreign Trade Zone. Recently, the construction of the southeast's largest ethanol plant began at the Port.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the largest employer in the area, provides jobs for nearly 2,000 people. They work at the Mississippi River Commission, The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers District Office or the Engineering and Research Development Center (ERDC). These vital organizations are responsible for the maintenance of the waterways in our nation and provide support for our military forces and security efforts all over the world. ERDC is home to one of the world's super computers.

Nearly 85 acres remain to develop at the Ceres Research and Industrial Interplex located 10 miles east of Vicksburg. This property is listed as one of Entergy's Certified Sites and is located on the automotive manufacturing corridor. Existing businesses include Tyson, Yorozu and others. Another business that came about because of the river is gaming. Four Riverboat casinos operate in Vicksburg and together employ over 1,500 individuals. With casino visitors and other tourists, the hotel/motel industries and restaurants have flourished. Business is booming in Vicksburg!



## Industry

As stated before, Vicksburg's close proximity to the Mississippi River is key to its economic survival. The city of Vicksburg imports and exports many goods. Its chief products are chemicals, metals and wood materials. Its major crops are soybeans, corn, wheat and cotton. There are more than 50 manufacturing firms in Warren County. They manufacture lighting fixtures, linerboard, petroleum, automotive parts and prefabricated housing.

The Port of Vicksburg has access to one the largest Port Complexes in the world, composed of the Port of South Louisiana and the Port of Greater Baton Rouge. The Port of South Louisiana stretches 54 miles along the river and exports more cargo each year than any other port in North America. At the Port of Vicksburg, within days a product will reach the Port Complex to be shipped. The Port of Vicksburg is a Foreign Trade Zone and has a United States Customs service.

The Ceres Research and Industrial Interplex plans to become one of the Southeast's major industrial centers. It offers land-based distribution solutions. Ergon Ethanol Incorporated and Bunge Grain have joined to build the biggest ethanol plant in the South. It is in the Vicksburg Industrial Harbor Development. Bunge is the world's largest processor of oilseeds. The plant claims to create new jobs and increase farm production/income in the future. Along with the Vicksburg Industrial Harbor Development, the E.W. Haining Industrial Center is connected to the Port of Vicksburg and can be reached by the Kansas City Southern Railroad.



## Healthcare

Vicksburg serves as the center for healthcare in Warren County and the surrounding areas. River Region Health System encompasses River Region Medical Center, River Region West Campus, Marian Hill Chemical Dependency Unit, Family Medicine Clinic, Southern Orthopedics Clinic, Street Clinic, Vicksburg Clinic, and Pain Management Clinic, as well as clinics in Port Gibson and Tallulah. The new River Region Medical Center, located at 2100 Highway 61 North in Vicksburg, is the largest single hospital project ever constructed in the state of Mississippi. The facility opened for patient care on February 17, 2002. The hospital features a state-of-the-art emergency facility including 27 beds and treatment rooms for trauma, cardiac episodes, and a "fast track" area for treating patients with less severe emergencies. An obstetrics/gynecology clinic is also located in the hospital.

Warren County is governed by a County Board of Supervisors made up of five members, each representing a separate district. County government regulates the Sheriff's Department and the Vicksburg-Warren School District. They are responsible for many county commissions including the Warren County Bridge Commission and the Warren County Port Commission.

The City of Vicksburg is governed by a Mayor and Board of two Aldermen. Each Alderman represents a district and the Mayor represents the entire city. The Vicksburg Police Department and the Vicksburg Fire Department are both managed by the city government. City board meetings and other activities can be watched on RCTV Channel 23, 24 hours a day. Vicksburg is the only municipality in Warren County.

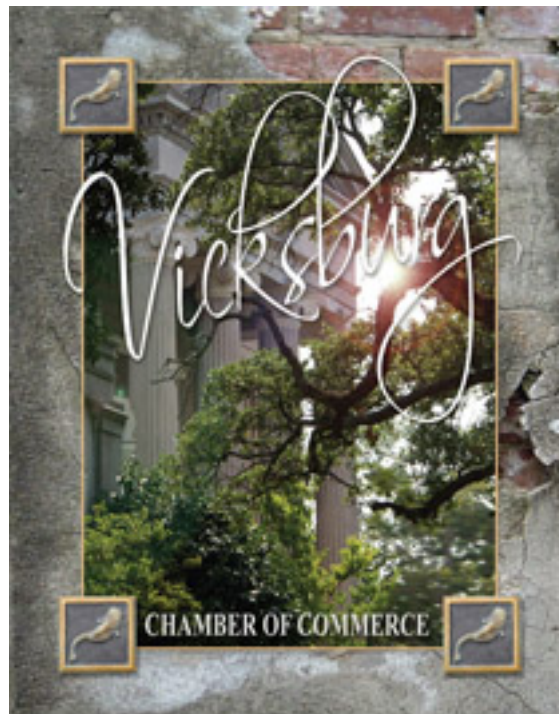


## **Worship**

Vicksburg's diverse religious congregations mirror the rich culture of the region. In fact, churches in Vicksburg represent more than 30 faiths. Many historic and beautiful churches survived the siege of Vicksburg. Reverend W. W. Lord actually conducted daily services at Christ Church during the battle of Vicksburg despite constant shelling. Holy Trinity, another historic and picturesque place of worship, has a memorial commemorating both Union and Confederate soldiers.

The strong church community in Vicksburg responds to many community needs. Congregations offer help in the form of food pantries, counseling services, clothing donations and shelters, to name a few. Some provide daycare and preschool services for the children in Warren County. Others offer programs for seniors. For certain, these churches have changed the lives of Warren County residents for the better, time and time again.

Other Civic organizations also positively impact the quality of life in Vicksburg. The United Way of West Central Mississippi serves 21 local agencies and touches the lives of thousands of citizens each year.
