With its proximity to the bustling city of Pittsburgh, Monroeville, Pennsylvania residents and visitors truly enjoy the peaceful suburban lifestyle the area offers. Beautiful neighborhoods, extensive shopping areas, top-rate educational institutions, high-quality healthcare services and a booming economic environment are just a few reasons Monroeville continues to attract new residents and businesses.

The progressive community provides its residents and visitors with all the significant amenities one may need – and if Monroeville does not have it, nearby Pittsburgh is easily accessible via the many major thoroughfares running throughout the area. Hailing as one of Pittsburgh’s oldest suburbs, Monroeville takes pride in having become a prosperous municipality since its inception in the early 1800s.

What’s more, the mature community has been undergoing rejuvenation efforts along its main thoroughfare and within its business district. In conjunction with the Streetscape effort, Monroeville has seen its primary business district turn into an attractive site with new sidewalks, lighting and landscaping, affording a more charming setting.

The area’s ideal location places it near many popular attractions. Not far from the community are Seven Springs Mountain Resort, the Pittsburgh Zoo and PPG Aquarium, three major league sports teams and several world class museums and amusement parks. And with around 850 acres of parkland, recreational activities are abounding.

It is no wonder this region of Pennsylvania is continuously recognized as one of the “most livable” areas in the country. Over the last several decades, Monroeville has thrived in all aspects of community life and strives to provide an even finer future for both residents and businesses in the area.



As Pittsburgh established itself as a bustling center in the late 1700s, more settlements were being established around the area. The eastern section near Pittsburgh remained fairly unpopulated at that time, and by the first half of the 1800s, what is now the municipality of Monroeville was merely comprised of a small town and widely-dispersed farms. It was not until the great Northern Turnpike was completed in 1807 that Monroeville began to expand.

By 1810, the town continued to grow and even had an inn, two blacksmith shops and two stores. In 1849, the village, named after Joel Monroe, the town's first postmaster, became a part of Patton Township.

Coal mining became an ever-expanding industry in the region in the late 19th century, leading to a boom in the township. By the 20th century, after the coal boom died down, Monroeville began to transform into a prosperous municipality, establishing itself as a thriving suburban community.

With the advent of the William Penn Highway in the 1940s, Monroeville's business and economic sector flourished, and soon, additional major roadways, including the Pennsylvania Turnpike, were completed in and around the municipality. Before long, major shopping districts and businesses, such as U.S. Steel, Westinghouse, Koppers Company and Bituminous Coal, began sprouting up all over Monroeville, leading to a growth in population and a demand for housing and refined highways.

The borough of Monroeville was incorporated on January 25, 1951. In the early to mid- 1960s, new roadways were established, affording easier access in and out of the area, with home construction increasing greatly. To this day, Monroeville continues to prosper, now boasting a population of nearly 30,000.



Nestled in Western Pennsylvania, a mere 12 miles east of the major city of Pittsburgh, Monroeville is comprised of approximately 19.5 square miles in Allegheny County. The municipality's ideal position in the region affords easy access to many of western Pennsylvania's popular attractions. Access to Monroeville is made easy by the connecting intersection of Interstate 376, Route 22 and the Pennsylvania Turnpike. Also winding through the community are U.S. Routes 48 and 130, providing for a connection to the other major roadways.

Free parking is available all over Monroeville, and for the visitor, the Convention Visitor's Bureau offers shuttle bus service to many of the area's popular sites for guests staying at member hotels.

Bus service is available through the Port Authority of Allegheny County, which provides transportation to downtown Pittsburgh, as well as sites across Allegheny County. What's more, a score of park-and-ride lots span the Monroeville community.

Monroeville is less than a 90-minute airplane ride from 20 states and Canada, and within 45 minutes, residents can access three airports, each offering commuter flights daily. Pittsburgh International Airport sits approximately 45 minutes from Monroeville and provides daily flights through a number of major airlines to points throughout the country and the world. Forty-minutes away is the Arnold Palmer Regional Airport in Latrobe, affording daily flights through Northwest Airlines. Connecting to Detroit, flyers coming from Arnold Palmer have access to countless sites throughout the world. A 12-minute ride will get commuters to the Allegheny County Regional Airport, which hails as the fifth busiest airport in the state.



For the visitor of Monroeville, an array of diverse attractions, dining establishments and lodging choices awaits. Spend the day taking in the sites, work up an appetite for one of the many delectable cuisines offered in the municipality, and come back to comfortable accommodations at the end of the night.

### **Attractions**

The surrounding area offers up a variety of attractions, ranging from entertainment hot spots to museums and historical sites.

A play space founded upon Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood of Make-Believe is located within the Monroeville Mall, a perfect place for the children to play while the adults indulge in the 180 stores that line the mall. Enjoy roller coasters and other fun rides at nearby Kennywood Park, or visit Idelwild Park and Story Book Forest for entertaining rides, a water park and an area for the children, situated only a short distance from Monroeville. For fun in the water, check out the Sandcastle Water Park, made up of water slides, a Lazy River, a boardwalk, go-karts and the Mon Tsunami Wave Pool.

The 77-acre Pittsburgh Zoo and PPG Aquarium is one of six zoo and aquarium combinations in the U.S. and provides a safe haven for more than 400 animals of numerous species, including 72 threatened or endangered species.

The Phipps Conservatory is a uniquely beautiful 13-room Victorian glass house filled with exotic plants, flowers and more. Also make sure to visit the National Aviary, home to over 500 species of exotic birds.

A brief drive will bring patrons to one of the area's museums, including the Children's Museum of Pittsburgh and the The Carnegie Science Center, each filled with a number of exhibits and hands-on activities. The Carnegie Museums of Art and Natural History provides visitors with a rich cultural experience that features world-class exhibits of art, dinosaurs and fossils, gems and minerals and insects and botany.

And for the history lover there is The Senator John Regional Heinz History Center. Several Monroeville historical sites are also available for touring, including the McGinley House, Old Stone Church, Old Stone Bridge, the McCully Log House and the historic Herb Garden, situated between the McGinley and McCully Log Houses. Additional nearby historical areas include Bushy Run, the site of the 1763 battle of Pontiac's Rebellion, and the Tour-Ed Mine and Museum, offering a look into the area's heritage in coal mining. The grounds also include a log cabin from 1789, a blacksmith shop, museum and more.

## **Dining**

The Monroeville community provides diners with a wide spectrum of restaurants, offering up everything from American and Italian cuisine to Chinese, Indian and Mexican fares.

Delicious Italian cuisine can be found at locally owned Palmieri's Restaurant or Pugliano's Italian Grill, among others. Palmieri's offers a comfortable dining experience, coupled with a cocktail lounge, sports bar and a nightclub, ZANDERS, featuring live entertainment. Lunch specialties at Palmieri's include the Eggplant Parmigiana and Palmieri's Famous Deep Friend Fish Sandwich, while the dinner specialties include Tenderloin Chasseur, Prime Filet Mignon, the Broiled Seafood Platter Alla Tony and an array of delicious pastas. Pugliano's serves up seafood, beef, chicken, pizza, pasta and its famous grilled burgers. The restaurant also provides live entertainment and events, such as wine tasting, and welcomes casual corporate events, birthday and graduation parties and reunions, to name a few.

The recently opened Rivertowne Pour House has quickly become quite a hit among residents in Monroeville. The microbrew not only serves up between 14 and 18 flavorful beers daily, but also has a long menu filled with mouthwatering foods, including a variety of appetizers, salads, seafood, pizza, chicken, sandwiches, wraps and submarines. Another pub to check out is D's Six Packs and Dogz, with around 20 different beers on tap, An additional 1,000 beers in stock and an extended menu of foods sure to please every palate.

For the ethnic lover, visit China Palace, Udipi Indian Restaurant, India Garden, Shogun Japanese Steak House and Taipei-Tokyo, each serving up delicious, authentic cuisine.

Further restaurants not to be missed include Mad Mex and Qdoba Grill for Mexican fare; La Cucina Dolce, Nick Marie's Esta Esta and Tolerico's for Italian cuisine, The Wooden Nickel for traditional American food and Monterey Bay, which offers diners the freshest seafood in town. Other local favorites include Eat 'n Park and Park Classic Diner, Chick-fil-A, Rudy's Subs, Houlihan's, Max & Erma's, Outback Steak House, TGI Friday's, Panera Bread and countless pizzerias. And do not forget to visit the nearby Moio's Italian Pastry Shop, hailed as one of the best bakeries in the Pittsburgh region.

## **Lodging**

Over 1,500 clean, comfortable rooms are available to those traveling to the Monroeville area. Several of the municipality's hotels have undergone massive renovations in the past year, including the Radisson Hotel, the Holiday Inn of Monroeville, the Red Roof Inn, the Days Inn and SpringHill Suites.

The \$7 million renovation of the Radisson has created a pleasant atmosphere among guests. Connected to the Pittsburgh ExpoMart, each room in the Radisson is equipped with an HDTV flat screen television and wireless high-speed Internet. The hotel also provides guests with an indoor and outdoor pool and complimentary guest passes to the premier Club 4 Life fitness center.

The 189-room Holiday Inn is equipped with free wireless high-speed Internet, a fitness facility and Madison's Restaurant and Lounge. For the business traveler, the newly renovated hotel offers a 24-hour business center and 11 meeting rooms.

Other hotels include the Hampton Inn Monroeville, Extended Stay America, for those needing long-term accommodations, and the recently opened Courtyard Marriott. Additional hotels have plans in the works to establish business in the municipality within the next year or so.



Those in search of high-quality, affordable living in proximity to major amenities will be pleased with all that Monroeville has to offer. One of the most admired communities in southwestern Pennsylvania, the municipality offers everything from apartment complexes and townhomes to charming single-family homes and lavish, custom-built estates, all available in an affordable range of prices.

Recreational opportunities are plentiful throughout the greater Monroeville area, with more than 24 municipal parks, two extensive health clubs, and several golf courses located in the immediate area. Over and above all of this is the Rails to Trails program, an effort to transform old railroad tracks from the Pittsburgh area through Washington D.C. into a beautiful trails system.

The Monroeville Parks and Recreation Department runs some 850 acres of parkland, comprised of 21 public parks. The majority of these parks are equipped with playing fields and courts, playground equipment, trails and more. In 2006, the new, 117-acre Monroeville Municipal Park opened, offering guests a botanical garden, bocce and tennis courts, sand volleyball courts and much more. Moreover, the department provides residents a comprehensive offering of diverse programs throughout the year.

Other popular Monroeville parks include Valley Park, home to the Monroeville Action Skate Park, and Allegheny County's Boyce Park. Boyce Park houses picnic areas, hiking trails, tennis courts, ball fields, a wave pool in the summer months and downhill ski and snowboard areas. The inexpensive ski area, with lift tickets going for a mere nine dollars, has nine runs for both beginners and intermediate riders. Additional city parks in the surrounding area include Point State Park, affording a scenic view of Three Rivers; the 456-acre Schenley Park, offering tennis courts, a considerable ice rink, hiking trails and a lake. Frick, Highland and Riverview Parks each offer educational programming and special events throughout the year.

The newly remodeled 168,000 square foot Club 4 Life facility in Pittsburgh affords patrons tennis courts, fitness studios, indoor and outdoor pools, basketball courts, racquetball and squash courts and much more. Also check out Monroeville's Paramount Athletic Club, Keystone Health Club, the local YMCAs and one of the area's four public swimming pools for a little healthy fun.

Monroeville residents have access to a number of public golf courses including Maple Crest Golf Course and nearby Chestnut Ridge Golf Resort and The Links at Spring Church. Local private country clubs, including Edgewood, Green Oaks, Longue Vue and Westmoreland also offer top-notch courses. Monroeville is also home to PAR 2 Miniature Golf Course, Monster Mini Golf and the McDain Golf Center's driving range.

Teenagers in the Monroeville area are afforded a site all their own. The Teen Oasis Center's mission is "to provide a safe, supervised, drug, alcohol and tobacco-free environment for teens in the Monroeville and Pitcairn communities to engage in healthy recreation and after-school activities." And for the senior population, the Monroeville Senior Citizens Center has become a popular spot for Monroeville and Pitcairn senior citizens. The center offers daily activities and programs including aerobic exercises, dancing, yoga, shuffleboard, card games, travel groups and arts and crafts, on top of many others. The center provides health and counseling services, as well as four social clubs that meet at the center monthly. Monroeville and its neighboring areas provide both residents and visitors with an array of entertainment and theatrical venues, sure to make for a great night on the town. And with neighboring downtown Pittsburgh affording a rich cultural environment, there is never a shortage of entertainment!

Neighboring Pittsburgh is the site of three professional major league sports teams – the Pittsburgh Penguins (NHL), Pittsburgh Pirates (MLB) and Pittsburgh Steelers (NFL) – affording a great time for the area’s avid sports fans.

Three multi-screen movie theaters are available in neighboring communities, Destinta Theatres in North Versailles, AMC Loews Waterfront in Homestead and Wynnsong 12 in Delmont, each providing movie-goers with the newest film features.

A host of theaters span the region, affording patrons popular productions of music, dance and theater. The Benedum Center for the Performing Arts is home to the Pittsburgh Ballet Theater, Pittsburgh Opera, Civic Light Opera, Pittsburgh Dance Council and the Pittsburgh Broadway Series compilation of the finest productions today.

The Byham Theater in Pittsburgh puts on music, dance and theater programs from well-known artists, new and old, while the Theatre Factory in neighboring Trafford produces modern plays by local performers and includes the child’s theater, KidWorks, and a dinner theater, run in conjunction with Parente’s Italian Restaurant. Another theater performing both adult and children’s plays is the Orchard Performing Arts Company who perform at the Apple Hill Playhouse and Lamplighter Restaurant.

The home base of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, Heinz Hall for the Performing Arts is also a close by site

for many events, concerts and traveling Broadway tours.



The area hails as a shopper's dream. With a wealth of charming shops, nationally-known retailers, shopping centers and an acclaimed regional mall, Monroeville is one of the most active retail communities in the surrounding region.

The extensive Monroeville Mall is equipped with over 180 distinct stores, ranging from clothing stores to collectible shops. The regional mall, situated on Business Route 22 in Monroeville, is anchored by three department stores – JC Penney, Macy's and Boscov's.

The Miracle Mile Shopping Center off of Route 22 is an outdoor shopping mall with over 30 stores including Old Navy, Marshall's and DSW Shoe Outlet and K&G Fashion Super Store. Mosside Plaza is home to 17 businesses ranging from eateries to medical offices.

Additional shopping districts include the Holiday Center, which houses several specialty shops; Jonnet Plaza with offices, stores and delicious restaurants; and the Plaza on Mall Boulevard. Or venture over to the Shops at Station Square, the largest riverfront development in Pittsburgh, and explore the shops at South Side Works. The Shops at Station Square is a site for 65 stores and 16 dining establishments. South Side Works is home to a wealth of upscale specialty stores, a cinema and great restaurants, including the Cheesecake Factory, Hot Metal Grille and McCormicks & Schmicks. Shoppers can also peruse through downtown Pittsburgh's shopping and dining offerings or the nearby Waterfront Entertainment Complex's various shops in nearby Homestead. While you're there, make sure to visit Dave & Busters and the Rock Bottom Restaurant & Brewery.



Fostering continuous learning in the community, Monroeville offers residents a top-rate public school district and access to several private, parochial and charter schools, as well as higher education institutions.

The Gateway School District is comprised of a 565-member staff and serves more than 4,300 students living in the municipalities of Monroeville and Pitcairn. Five elementary schools, providing education from kindergarten through fourth grade, two middle schools and one high school make up this choice district. Gateway High School has recently completed the final phase of its massive renovation project, updating the school's stadium, cafeteria, classrooms, auditorium and the hallway infrastructure.

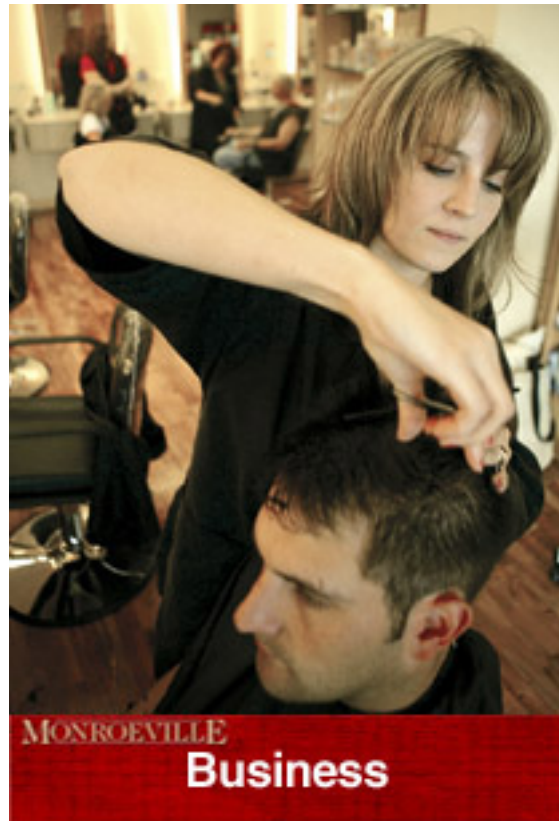
Several private, parochial and charter institutions also call Monroeville home, including North American Martyrs Catholic; St. Bernadette Elementary School; Greater Works Academy; Snowdrop Elementary, offering a focus in the fields of science and math; Spectrum Charter, specializing in the education of Autistic students; Sunrise School, offering an educational program for special needs students; and countless others located in Pittsburgh and the surrounding areas.

For those in search of education post-high school, numerous colleges and universities are situated under 40 miles from Monroeville. The Boyce Campus of the Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC) in Monroeville stands as the largest provider of education services in the western region of the state. Enrolling over 13,000 students annually, CCAC offers a number of academic programs and continuing education classes. Students attending the college are given the opportunity to receive Associate's degrees in Arts, Science and Applied Science, along with certificates and diplomas.

Top colleges located at hand in Pittsburgh include the University of Pittsburgh, Carnegie Mellon University, the

Art Institute of Pittsburgh, Point Park University, Duquesne University, Carlow University and LaRoche College. Additional sites for higher learning, situated only a short drive from Monroeville, include Penn State Allegheny Campus in McKeesport, Seton Hill University in Greensburg, Robert Morris College in Moon Township, Westmoreland County Community College in Youngwood and Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, among many others.

Monroeville's adults and dedicated workforce are provided opportunities for further training and education as well. Institutions including ITT Technical Institute, the Career Training Academy-Monroeville, the Bella Capelli Academy, the Western School of Health and Business, Forbes Road Career and Technology Center, and the University of Phoenix all provide comprehensive courses to the region's adults and labor base.



Boasting a locale just outside of the thriving city of Pittsburgh, holding a population of approximately 30,000 and affording easy accessibility to the area's interstate highways and airports, Monroeville is an ideal site for businesses of all kinds. Not only is Monroeville one of the Pittsburgh region's major retail hubs, filled with a host of stores and restaurants, but it is also the home to virtually every type of major industry. Many of the top companies in the area, each serving the community in a variety of ways, are proud to call Monroeville home.

PPG Industries, specializing in coatings and specialty products and services, has 125 manufacturing sites in more than 20 countries. Pittsburgh is the site for the company's corporate headquarters, and Monroeville is the home to PPG's Chemical Research Center.

Compunetix, Inc. is positioned within Monroeville, specializing in state-of-the-art multi-media and telecommunications systems for audio and video conferencing for the aerospace, military, civilian and government markets. Additional main industrial companies in nearby communities include Wabtec Corp., serving the freight and passenger rail, transit, marine, power generation, off-highway equipment and industrial markets, with headquarters located in Wilmerding; and Respironics, providing modern products to the global sleep and respiratory markets.

Located adjacent to Monroeville and just three miles from the PA Turnpike is the AGX Intermodal. Since 1998, the Intermodal has offered a complete array of dryage and full truckload services, with local, national and international shipping connections.

Monroeville businesses have valuable access to resources that support the business environment of the area. The Monroeville Chamber of Commerce works with nearly 700 diverse businesses, both large and small, in the local

area. Offering support to its business members in the area with over 160 events and advocacy and educational programs annually is key. The Chamber provides unlimited networking and marketing opportunities that encourage businesses to forge vital alliances. The organization's main mission in the community is "... supporting, encouraging, attracting and advancing responsible growth and business development in Monroeville and the surrounding communities." Supporting the healthy lifestyles of residents living in the Monroeville area is a wealth of conveniently located medical facilities specializing in a broad range of health care fields. What's more, greater Monroeville is serviced by many diverse medical practices that span the area including optometry, orthopedics, rehabilitation, oncology, cardio-pulmonary, podiatry, internal medicine, pediatrics, chiropractic and more.

The 340-bed Western Pennsylvania Hospital–Forbes Regional Campus is located in Monroeville, providing high quality medical care to eastern Allegheny County and Westmoreland County residents. More than 65,000 patients are admitted to the hospital each year, with around 10,000 surgeries performed. Over 40,000 visits are recorded at the recently expanded Gerald McGinnis Emergency Department annually, making it one of the busiest Emergency Departments in the entire region. The renowned Joslin Diabetes Center is also affiliated with Western Pennsylvania Hospital and located on the Forbes Regional Campus.

Presently, the Western Pennsylvania Hospital–Forbes Regional Campus is experiencing a \$24 million enhancement project in the hospital, which includes a modern Heart and Vascular Center, facilities for advanced surgery procedures and the newly finished Women's and Infant's Care Center. This new center offers 11 new labor, delivery, recovery and postpartum care rooms, cutting-edge medical equipment, a Level I Nursery, a Level II Special Care Nursery and many more necessities. The comprehensive construction is slated for completion in spring of 2008.

The University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC) Presbyterian is located in the Oakland portion of Pittsburgh and hails as an advanced medical/surgery hospital. The hospital is acclaimed for its expertise in organ transplantation and is a pioneer in cardiology and cardiothoracic surgery, critical care and trauma services and neurosurgery. On top of that, UPMC Presbyterian is designated as a Level I Regional Resource Trauma Center.

A stone's throw from Monroeville is the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, the only hospital in the western portion of the state dedicated to providing health services to infants, children and young adults. Both U.S. News & World Report and Child Magazine named the hospital one of the top 10 children's hospitals in the country.

Also situated in Pittsburgh is the Magee-Women's Hospital, a full-service medical facility now serving both men and women in a wide range of healthcare specialties. The hospital, the site for nearly 10,000 births annually, has been accredited as a National Center of Excellence in Women's Health, is recognized as the regional referral center for high-risk maternal care and is equipped with the largest neonatal intensive care unit in the state with the treatment of more than 1,000 seriously or critically ill newborns each year. The hospital serves as a teaching site for the University of Pittsburgh, offering education in obstetrics, gynecology, gynecologic oncology and neonatology.

For the older generation, a number of assisted living facilities are located within a 15-mile radius of Monroeville. Situated in the community near the Forbes Regional Campus is ManorCare Health Services, providing nursing care, sub-acute and medical rehabilitation short-term care and Alzheimer's care and HealthSouth Hospital providing rehabilitative and acute long term care. Additional facilities include LGAR Health and Rehabilitation Center, Amber Glen, Autumn Ridge Assisted Living, Beverly Health Care, Beatty Pointe Village, the Cedars of Monroeville, Sunrise Assisted Living, Woodhaven Care Center, Arden Court and Independence Court.



Monroeville's government takes pride in its progressive attitude toward the management of the community. The municipality is a Home Rule Charter community, encompassing a seven-member council, an elected mayor and a municipal manager. Working together, the council, mayor and municipal manager aim to increase the standard of life among residents, businesses and visitors in the area.

The Monroeville Police Department is comprised of 51 sworn officers within five divisions – Special Operations Division, Detective Division, Traffic Division, Patrol Division and a K-9 Unit. Making over 18,000 service calls annually, the department also heads several community programs, such as Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) programs, safety programs and neighborhood and business crime watch programs. Additional public safety comes from five volunteer fire departments that serve the residents of Monroeville.

The community offers a variety of religions and denominations, each working towards the betterment of community through faith. Moreover, Monroeville is world-renowned for its rich Hindu culture, hailing as one of the first municipalities in the nation to house a Hindu temple.
