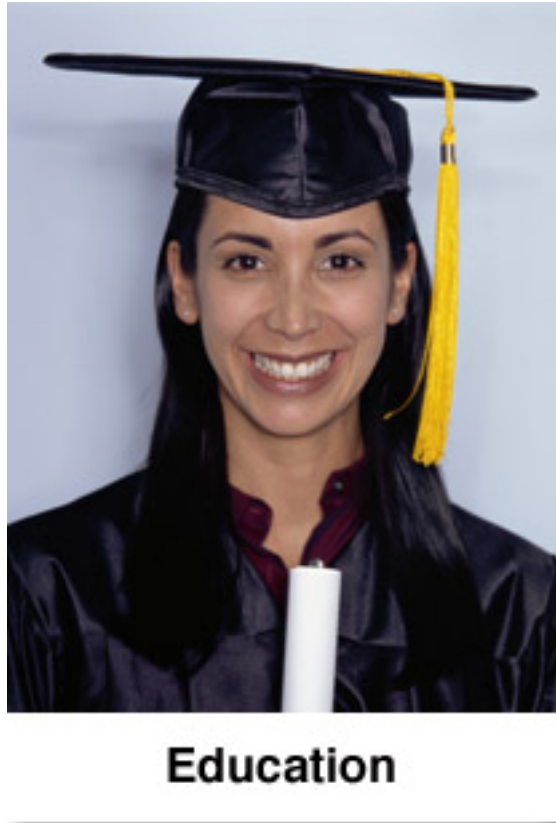

## **Government**

Our Town Government is headed by a Town Manager who is appointed by the Town Council, a group of five members elected by the residents of the town. Various other officials, committees, boards and commissions are also appointed or elected to assist in planning and fulfilling the needs of the town.



## **Education**

We have nationally recognized Schools of Excellence! The town operates its educational program for grades K through 12 under its own supervision. All schools, Jameson (K-3), Loranger Middle School (4-8) and the High School (9-12) have either been refurbished, rebuilt, or newly constructed within the last 20 years. The Old Orchard Beach school system is abreast of the newest educational advances in the state.

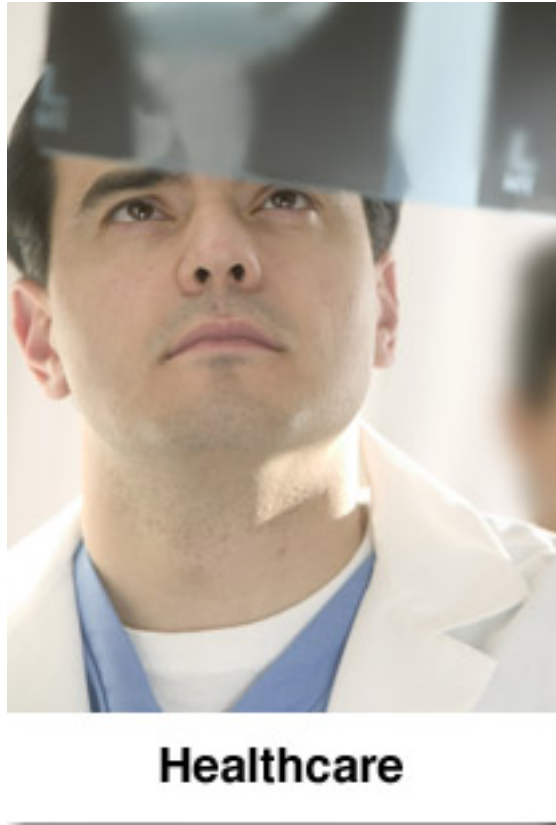
The Old Orchard Beach high school is a nationally recognized “school of excellence.” The town is a member of RSU #23 which operates the education programs for grades K-12. All schools, Jameson (K-3), Loranger Middle School (4-8) and the High School (9-12) have either been refurbished, rebuilt, or newly constructed within the last 20 years. The Regional School Unit 23 school system is abreast of the newest educational advances in the state.

The pursuit of excellence in education is strengthened by a balance that exists between academics, extracurricular activities and the concern for individual growth. The RSU 23 school system continues to grow with a vision toward the future by “preparing its citizens for the ever-changing needs of a global society.”



**Worship**

Churches of various denominations are located in the immediate area. In 1881, a Free Will Baptist colony was established in Ocean Park and has flourished ever since. The Salvation Army took residence in 1885. Three local churches, the Methodist Church, St. Margaret's Church and The Temple in Ocean Park have surpassed their centennial years in existence. The area is home to the Beth Israel Congregation and many other places of worship.



The community has excellent Emergency Services available. The police department, fire department and rescue unit have full-time, year-round staffs which expand significantly during the summer tourist season to serve populations which may expand to 100,000 people daily.

The nearest Medical Services are located just a few miles away at Southern Maine Medical Center (SMMC) in Biddeford, Maine. SMMC is a 150 bed, full-service, not for profit acute care hospital providing medical, surgical, obstetric and mental health services. The Saco Health Care Center provides outpatient and diagnostic services and home healthcare services are provided to the community by SMMC affiliate Southern Maine Health & Homecare Services.

## **Libraries & Museums**

The Edith Belle Libby Memorial Library is located in the center of town on Staples Street, houses over 24,000 volumes, and subscribes to approximately 75 periodicals. ## Location & Transportation

The land area of the town is comprised of residential, business, industrial, commercial and resource protection zones, open space, farmland, woodland and coastal areas totaling 7.5 square miles. It is home to a year round population of 8,500 people. The town is located on the northeasternmost (D/E-3/4) section of York County on the southern Maine coast and is approximately 12 miles southwest of the city of Portland, Maine's largest city. Convenient access to Old Orchard Beach is provided by the U.S. Interstate route I-95 Connector, which originates at Exit 36 and 98, each of which originates at U.S. Route 1 in Saco, from the south and north respectively, to terminate at the town's center.



## History

Old Orchard Beach has an incredible history with records dating back to 1653. Its first settler, Thomas Rogers, established "Garden by the Sea" in 1657. The "old" apple orchard from which the town took its name, a landmark to sailors for many years, was on high land above the long sand beach. In 1837, E. C. Staples was coaxed into taking summer boarders at his farm for \$1.50 per week. Convinced of Old Orchard's potential as a summer resort, Staples built the first Old Orchard boarding house near the top of today's Old Orchard Street.

The next century saw the growth of the nation and the growth of tourism as a viable market on which to base Old Orchard Beach's economy. Accommodations and attractions of all sorts were built to bring in the tourists. Hotels, stores, amusement parks, racetracks and various other diversions were built to attract the masses, which came to include entertainers like Duke Ellington, public figures like Charles Lindbergh and wealthy families like the Fitzgeralds and the Kennedys.

The decades followed and tourism continued to be the main thrust of the economic base in Old Orchard Beach. The 1950s and 60s saw the advent of motels and an economy whose clientele catered in large numbers to the Canadian market. In the mid-80s, there was a conscious effort by the local business, government and residential community to revitalize the downtown area and its immediate surroundings. This cooperative effort resulted in new Victorian lighting, wide brick tree-lined sidewalks, and an outside dining courtyard complete with fountain in Town Square and a newly renovated Town Hall.



## **Tourism**

Recognizing the importance of staying competitive in the tourism business and meeting the needs of our residential community as well, the community has a progressive vision for the future. It is more convenient than ever to get to Old Orchard Beach with The Downeaster (Amtrak) Train Service stopping just steps from the Beach six times daily from May 1 - October 31. The trains travel from Boston to the Beach on their route to Portland, stopping right next to our new Chamber Welcome Center. The town has plans drawn for a new community recreation center and the renovation of our existing Memorial Park.

The many changes have made for a very positive effect to Old Orchard Beach and its community. The American family has rediscovered our seaside community. Our motel and hotel rooms, quaint inns, B&Bs and campgrounds cater to every imaginable taste. Our dining establishments include award winning pizza and pier fries, cotton candy and caramel corn, family style and even five-star dining.

Old Orchard Beach is a community in which residents and tourists alike may take full advantage of a restful day on our seven-mile stretch of wide-open beach. Enjoy any of the dozens of rides and arcade games at Palace Playland, our seaside amusement park. Funtown/Splashtown USA is home to one of the largest wooden roller coasters in the country as well as a giant waterpark. In addition, the Chamber of Commerce provides a series of year-round events for residents and tourists alike to enjoy.

If one is looking for the "quieter side" of Old Orchard Beach, try camping, hiking or biking in our nearby state park, canoeing and bird watching in the saltwater marsh nature center area of Scarborough/Pine Point. There are few experiences that can compare to the peacefulness and privacy of strolling the sands of Old Orchard Beach looking for seashells. Whether your interest in our seaside community is to spend a vacation with a treasure chest full of wonderful memories or to relocate to the area, Old Orchard Beach is the right choice for you and your

family.

## Top 10 Things To Do

2. **Awesome Amusement Parks** – Old Orchard Beach’s old-fashioned seaside carnival atmosphere will delight the kids and the kid in you. Ferris Wheels, wild rides, games of chance, G-Forces, pick your pleasure... our beachfront amusement parks are packed with fun for the whole family. New England’s last remaining seaside amusement park.
3. **Kayak or Canoe** – Commune with nature, paddle Maine’s largest saltwater marsh in your own canoe or kayak and discover an abundance of wildlife. Or set your sights to sea on a fishing charter for a day of intense pursuit.
4. **Meet at the Pier** – Explore the centerpiece Pier that dates back to 1898. This famous boardwalk that stretches out over the Atlantic has a life all of its own.
